

Athletics (December 2011)

Where does athletics report? Does the athletics supervisor sit on the cabinet? What is athletics budget? How many sports does the athletics budget support? Are coaches allowed to fundraise apart from Advancement? Where do club sports report? Where do intramurals report?

Birmingham Southern College

Athletics reports to the President. The athletics supervisor recently sits on the cabinet.

The athletic budget is approximately \$2.5 million. This budget supports 20 varsity team. 10 each for men and women. Coaches are allowed to fundraise though, these are coordinated efforts with Advancement.

Both club sports and intramurals report to Student Delopment – Director of Physical Fitness and Recreation.

Centre College

Division III

Athletics reports to the President. The athletics supervisor does not sit on the cabinet. Athletic Director is part of “Expanded Senior Staff” – which adds about 5 other staff to a meeting once a month.

The athletics budget is approximately \$2.3 million. This budget supports 12 women’s and 11 men’s teams. Coaches are not allowed to fundraise apart from Advancement.

Both club sports (recognized by Student Government Association) and intramurals report to Athletics.

Morehouse College

Division II

Athletics report to VP Enrollment Management and Student Services (EMSS). The athletics supervisor sits on the Extended Cabinet (which has about 30 persons, including VPs, Deans and key directors), but not with the President and VP’s when they meet.

The athletics budget is \$3.2 million, inclusive of scholarships, salaries and all operational costs. This budget supports 7 sports (Football, Cross Country, Basketball, Baseball, Tennis, Golf and Track & Field). Coaches are allowed to fundraise only after first verifying that the outreach does not conflict with Advancement effort.

Both club sports and Intramurals report to Recreation, Intramurals and Fitness (RIF), a department separate from Athletics, but within the EMSS division.

Rhodes College

Athletics reports to the Dean of Students. The Dean of Students sits on cabinet and does not report directly to President.

The athletics budget is \$2,823,000 (including salaries). This budget supports 10 men’s and 10 women’s sports. Coaches are allowed to fundraise a small amount without coordination with Advancement. That’s being reviewed.

Both club sports and intramurals report to Athletics.

Athletics (December 2011)

Rollins College

Division II

Athletics reports to the Dean of the College. Athletic Director does not sit on the cabinet; VP for Planning and Dean of the College does.

The athletic budget is about \$6.5-\$7.5 million. This budget supports 23 varsity sports. Coaches are allowed to fundraise apart from Advancement, yet is likely to be reviewed as we approach comprehensive campaign.

Both club sports and intramurals report to Athletics.

University of Southwestern (Sewanee)

Athletics reports to the VP for Student Life & President on NCAA matters. The athletics supervisor does not sit on the cabinet.

The athletics budget is approximately \$2 million. This budget supports 18 sports. Coaches are not allowed to fundraise apart from Advancement.

Both club sports and Intramurals report to the Assoc. VP and Dean of Students.

University of Richmond

Division I for all sports. Division 1AA for Football

Athletics supervisor reports to the President and sits on the Cabinet.

Huge athletics budget. Some of the budget is endowed. There are two major gift officers that jointly report to Athletics and Advancement. They handle most of the athletic fundraising.

Both club sports and Intramurals report to Student Development.

Washington and Lee University

Division III

Athletics reports to the Provost. The athletics supervisor does not sit on the cabinet, but is a part of the larger President's Council group.

The athletics budget supports 24 teams. Coaches coordinated through Advancement to fundraise.

Both club sports and intramurals report to Student Affairs.
