

Emergency Contraception (October 2011)

How do you handle emergency contraception on campus (if you do)?

Birmingham-Southern College

The Health Center consults with students where appropriate on these requests. You can get this at the drugstore without a prescription; students are sent to the nearby CVS because they keep it in stock. They just need a valid ID and must be at least 17 years old.

Centre College

We do provide emergency contraceptive. It's not on the self-help shelf so we have the opportunity to discuss reason/birth control options/other possible issues. It is also available at the local health dept and is over the counter at several local retail stores (more expensive).

Hendrix College

We do not have emergency contraception in the Health Center at Hendrix.

Rollins College

We carry emergency contraception in the Health Center. We ask students to come in to review the reason for their need. This helps us determine the need for further contraception counseling and/or other health care education.

Trinity University

Emergency contraception is available in Health Services, during regular hours, after consulting with a nurse.

University of Richmond

Information about emergency contraception is on the Student Health Center website. We include education about it to any student seeking contraception information seen in the SHC. The nurses are available through the Dial A Nurse phone system to talk to any student about emergency contraception. All the nearby pharmacies carry it and information about their locations/ hours of operation/ phone number is available on the SHC website. Students may call and ask for a price quote as the price varies greatly. If a student wants/ needs a pregnancy test they are free at the SHC. We do not dispense it- we do not dispense any medications except Tylenol and Advil.
