III. Evaluation Framework

How do you plan to evaluate what you want to accomplish? What questions do you want answered? What information (data) do you need to answer the questions? Which assessments will give you the best information for your needs? What criteria or standards do you have for your findings? How will you know success? Who does the work?

The first page shows how you might address an objective for the collaboration project. On the second page, space is provided for you to complete the process with your appreciation or satisfaction objective.
