

"A Journey into Information Fluency: Integrating Information Fluency into the Hendrix College Journeys Course"

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The IF project is still in progress. The central focus of our project was having an IF expert work with the 18 faculty members who teach Journeys, a new freshmen commons course, and introduce these faculty members to IF principles. We had originally planned to do this last spring but were not able to get all the Journeys faculty together at the same time.

Our workshop is scheduled for Nov. 5. Susan Hagen from Birmingham Southern will be leading the workshop. We have created a Journeys Special Collection which is prominently positioned in Bailey Library. We have a draft of the Journeys Web Pages on the Bailey Library home page (<http://www.hendrix.edu/baileylibrary>). What you see of the draft Journeys Web Pages will be a completed draft before the workshop. [Our intent is the professional/non-draft version will be available AFTER our first round of teaching this course--at the end of this fall semester.] We also have an information fluency web page for the faculty in progress, and we plan to have that available before the Nov. 5 workshop. Our proposal also mentioned developing an information fluency book collection for teaching faculty. We have done this but have, at the request of the teaching faculty, expanded the scope a bit to actually start a small "Faculty Development Collection" with resources (including IF resources) to help faculty members improve their teaching skills.
